Entry

- Refer to individual Departments for entry times.
- Limited to two (2) exhibits per exhibitor in each Department exhibitor is already entered in, unless specified differently within individual department's rules.
- Submit entry in the Department which the subject matter of the exhibit relates.
- Exhibitor must be enrolled in the project which relates to the subject matter.
- Individual department rules may specify entry form requirements, example separate entry form. Check with Superintendent if not listed.
- Entry tags available from Superintendent – Entry tag should show name, club name, and exhibitor's age.

Eligibility

- Entries must be work of the exhibitor and be made or produced during current 4H year.
- This class is established for succinct exhibits that can be viewed from a distance of 10-20 feet. Larger and/or more complex displays, including tri-folds, may be suitable for entry in Department Z, Educational Displays.
- Entries in Informational Exhibits cannot be cross entered in or receive premiums awarded from the Educational Display, Department Z.

Criteria

- Size Guidelines: Posters, charts, graphs may range in size: Minimum 14" x 22"; Maximum 22" x 28".
- Other exhibits: Minimum 24" x 36", Maximum 36" x 48".
- Verify maximum size requirements for individual departments prior to delivery or entry of exhibit.
- Exhibits must stimulate thought, teach facts, or show a process.
- Any special requirements within a department, i.e., size, matting, ready to be hung, etc., must be adhered to for the informational exhibit as well.
- Use of copyrighted material will disqualify an Informational Exhibit.
- Points may be deducted for incorrect information on an Informational Exhibit.
- Exhibit, which contains incorrect information, may be judged but not displayed.
- The reference source must be written on the back of the exhibit.

Release of Exhibits:

Judging Criteria & Scoring:

Message (50%)

- One main idea
- Facts are accurate; opinions are clearly conveyed as such
- Stimulates thought or teaches an idea
- Interesting to audience; relevant for the community

Design (30%)

- Easily read from 10 ft.; illustrations easily observed from 10 ft.
- Lettering is neat, well-planned; consistent spacing; balanced; flow of information clear and easy to follow
- Lettering is readable and attractive, spelling correct; style adds interest or attracts viewers
- Illustrations contribute to the main idea, are adequately labeled or captioned as needed, based on audience's knowledge
- Layout is balanced, neat, well-planned; consistent spacing

Overall Presentation (20%)

- Colors are harmonious and effectively used
- Layout is neat, organized, and orderly
- Size and materials comply with entry requirements for Dept. Y and related project department, including label specifications for department
- Entry is presentable, intact, and sturdy; content securely affixed
- Idea or its presentation is imaginative, original
- Attracts viewer's attention
- Content and/or presentation is appropriate for the age group of the member
